Detroit Avenue Improvements

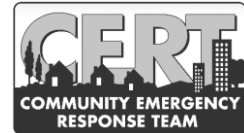
The City of Concord held a neighborhood meeting at the Meadow Homes School on January 20, 2015 to present the refined plans for the Detroit Avenue Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements Project. The refinements include having the budget for the traffic signals be used instead for pavement rehabilitation to fix the potholes and puddles. Also, the plans now include more street lighting and a 4-way stop at Walters Way.

The project will be presented to the City Council at its meeting on Tuesday March 10 at 7:00 PM. The project construction will begin in the summer of 2015.

Clean Up Day is Saturday, May 30

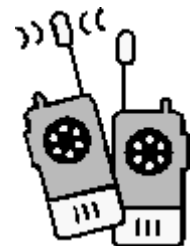

Emergency Preparedness and Neighborhood Radio Network

Some of our neighbors have taken the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training classes. In case of a disaster emergency, we are able to help our neighbors when first responders are too busy to be available.

The City of Concord's Disaster Communications Plan has neighborhood CERT teams using Family Radio Service (FRS) two-way radios, and amateur radio operators for CERT teams to communicate with the City's Emergency Operations Center.

We practice using our two-way radios every Saturday from 10:00 AM to 10:30 AM on FRS channel 8 (sub-channel zero). Here is where Nik, Peter and Dave meet on the radio to announce upcoming events and share information of concern to the neighborhood. Concord Park neighbors and CERT members are invited to join us on the radio network. We will gladly provide instruction on how to use your two-way radio. No license is required.

Also, the City of Concord CERT plans to have an emergency response Radio Exercise on Saturday March 21, in which we will participate.
